Knowledge Translation: A guide to getting started

Alison Bell is a graduate of the MPH program at UQ and has worked as a research project manager in the health and higher education sector for over 20 years. Alison is a passionate advocate for the benefits of health research to the community, believing good health research can and should translate to better preventative health measures, better treatments, better healthcare provision and improved health outcomes for all citizens.
